Renowned social scientist Ervin Staub, pioneer of the psychology of evil, on the underlying psychology of violent acts and how their victims are affected.

The author of *Positive Social Behavior & Morality* and *The Roots of Evil*, Staub focuses on altruistic behavior and on acts of violence, genocide, and torture: "I wanted to do what I could to create a world in which human beings won't do horrible things to each other." One of the children saved from Hitler by Raoul Wallenberg in Budapest at the end of WWII, Staub came to the US after the Hungarian revolution of 1956 and began his distinguished career in psychology.
